The Leaf I was watching one of those black and white short stories on the television. I have never forgotten it. It was set in a rundown tenement building in a very poor part of a big American city at the turn of the 20th century. It was the beginning of winter, and among the struggling residents was a dying young woman. There was a vine growing over a brick wall just outside her window and the leaves were beginning to fall. She had it in her mind that when the last leaf left the vine, then she would die. In consequence she watches that vine very carefully every day. At the same time there was a penniless artist living in the apartment below. No one had time for him. His art works were clearly too modern for them and most doubted his artistic ability, anyway. In fact, they were absolutely disparaging of him. His painting was not real for them and that told them everything about who and what he was. The poor man could not make a living, somehow the details have escaped me, but the artist met up with the young woman's sister who was looking after her. He ended up visiting her and sharing some of their meager soups from time to time as well. He heard the woman's story about her last leaf on the vine and like others saw her demise as the leaves disappeared. He went away at some stage and no one knew where he was and as the blizzards hit nobody really searched for him either. The woman in the sick bed continued to keep looking at the wall and miraculously she found that one single leaf refused to leave the vine. She took heart as the leaf hung onto life, so did she to the point that she made a recovery. When spring began to warm the wall and the new leaves appeared that brown leaf somehow stayed on the vine. A grisly discovery was made when the snow began to melt. The body of the artist was found right beneath the young woman's window. There was a ladder as well along with some paints and brushes. The artist that no one had belief in had died painting a leaf on the wall so as to keep another person alive. Sometimes we can give up on ourselves. Perhaps, not being like others, not making the same contribution, not being able to do what others do. We are in good company they said that about Jesus too! Sometimes we can give up on others as well as ourselves. Never giving them the chance to do whatever it is they do and in both cases no one is healed. We never know how many leaves we paint on the wall. The bare walls of people's lives by a simple word, a simple smile, let us go painting this week.
