Inquiry into the Children and Community Services Amendment Bill 2019.

Standing Committee on Legislation

On 25th June 2020 the Legislative Council referred the Children and Community Services Bill 2019 (Bill) to the Committee for inquiry and report by 15th September. The Bill amends the Children and Community Services Act 2004 to implement recommendations of the Final Report of the Royal Commission into Institutional Response to Child Sexual Abuse and Statutory review of the Act. As part of its consultation, the Standing Committee on Legislation **invites written submissions** on matters relating to the Bill, such as its scope, purpose, structure and policy. **The closing date for submissions is Friday 24th July 2020.**

One of the main purposes of the amendments to the Children and Community Services Act 2004 is to introduce mandatory reporting of child abuse for ministers of religion which includes

“religious confession”. In short, any information disclosed to a priest during the course of Confession, which leads the priest to believe that a minor is being sexually abused must be reported to the authorities, irrespective of the wishes of the penitent. Failure to do so will constitute a criminal offence under the proposed amendment. The Bill includes a number of amendments which relate to ministers of religion becoming designated mandatory reporters of sexual abuse. This is not limited to confession but to all aspects of a priest's ministry.

The contents of the Archbishop's Open Letter to the Catholic Community regarding this matter is available through the eRecord .

As outlined on the Parliament of Western Australia's website, individuals and organisations are invited to make submissions to the Standing Committee. Parishioners may consider lodging an individual submission or work in groups of parishioners and other interested people to lodge a joint submission.” It is hoped that in doing so the widespread concerns of Catholics about this fundamental challenge to such an important aspect of our Catholic faith might be strongly communicated to our politicians.”
