The story goes about a pastor and his congregation This was about a man who had been on the road for many years. He knew the seasons of failure and the seasons of success. He knew the weariness of all mankind. If there was a story of misery the man had not only heard about it but also had been part of it. As he got older all the memories got sharper. This was a man who not always got it right and he knew it. On this Sunday there he was again giving the Good News to his flock when suddenly he found himself over come with great sense of unworthiness. Being the man he was, he said so to his congregation. Just then Jesus appeared to him and began to place a crown upon his head. Even still more so he was aware of his sinfulness and unworthiness, so he drew back and tried not to shun the crown which our Lord was offering to him. As he did so, he noticed that the crown was not clean. It had thumb prints all over it and so he stepped forward. As the Lord placed the crown on his head the thumb prints turned into jewels. You and I have thumb prints all over our bodies, have we not? We have not always got it right and even today as we are here, we are probably in the grip of that very thing. So here is what is suggested that we should do. Close our eyes now (not if you are driving a vehicle at the moment nor watching the young grandchildren), Close your eyes and see. See the Lord standing right in front of you. He holds and has a crown, a crown of your life in his hands. Can you recognize the thumb prints on them and what they are? Tell him about them if you can see them and then whisper to him, "I accept from your hands the life that I have lived. I claim it with all my mistakes." The Lord now places the crown on your head. Watch what he does with it and then bow your head in gratitude. And you know what he has just done? He has just bowed his head in gratitude to you. Remembering our main task as God's children and as disciples of Christ is to be open and receptive to the "sower"; to His Word, Jesus' life giving Word. We must leave the growth and harvest in God's hands. Nevertheless, irrespective of our different capabilities, as not everyone is capable of producing a hundredfold, we are called to strive to do our very best in allowing that seed that God has planted in each of us to flourish. At the end of the day we will not be judged by results but by the efforts we have made. May we accept that thumb marked crown that he places upon our head and may it be a reminder that He, the sower loves us and continues to offer us nutrition as we provide the soil bed for his seeding to grow and feed others to.
