There is a story told of an elderly couple who longed to make a trip to the Amsterdam National Museum in order to see a Rembrandt painting, "The Night Watch".

The closest I have ever come to seeing Rembrandt's famous works are in picture books. So typical of Rembrandt's work, there is the play of colour, the fall of light on the subject and as such one feels drawn right into the scene, examining the characters and working out the story in the painting before you realise that you are doing it. No wonder many people visit the Museum to admire it.

The couple went to no end of trouble to get there. Then there were the many long walks along the numerous corridors until they reached the famous painting. I could just imagine the elderly couples' arrival o being able to stand in front of this famous painting for the first time and study the work for themselves. The usher overheard the husband say to the wife, "Oh look, what a beautiful frame!" From that moment on their attention was firmly fixed on right there, the glories of the work of art was lost on them!!

It isn't really uncommon is it? You could even hear this type of thing in conversation. You could be talking to someone about something important to you and the other could be caught up on really, an incidental, the "red herring", something that does not really matter. It was just that bit that you put in in the end of the conversation to frame it and you realise you have not been heard at all.

I know someone who as a child had decided to polish the lino, yes, the lino on the floor while the mother was out and so to give her a big surprise when she would get back. It took for ages and she waited for her mother to arrive back with eager anticipation. She couldn't wait to see the smile on her face and to hear words of gratitude that would be inevitably said. Instead the mother pointed out the edges of the room that the child missed. After all these years that story can still be told with amazing freshness. If it is good enough for God to ignore the frame in us and look straight into what really matters couldn't we do the same? Furthermore, this week, let's make a pact to look beyond the frame of what happens to you and me. What happens inside us and what happens around us and let's look with God's eyes to what really matters.
