You will probably already know what I am about to share with you, but nevertheless it was news to me when I heard it. So, let me pass on my new-found piece of information that is already known to you. Apparently, the heart has the capacity to send messages to the brain and it's out of that, that you and I act, behave. Something happens between our heart beats that is when the messages are sent onto the brain. You and I, we faced that loads and loads of times, haven't we? We perceive insult, our heart registers that and it gets to the brain and you and I act. So often you and I act inappropriately, and we are sorry about it afterwards. There is something else though, sometimes things happen but you and I just can't handle. We are a washed with emotions of one kind or another. Perhaps we have had an experience of rejection or we have felt abandonment, or we are caught in grief. Some of those things even by our own fault. When we are caught up in those sorts of things it is often difficult for both you and I to find the words to express what is going on. Sometimes there isn't anybody to tell anyway and we sit there are left in our isolation. I would like to put forward to you something that I have discovered for myself. You know when those times hit you, when you don't have the words? It is a really good idea to sit quietly even for just a minute and say to the Lord, "Speak to my heart. Speak to my heart" and say it over and over again, that way the words from God, the words of peace, comfort, clarity, consolation, they are words that fill up that space between your heart beat. They are the words that go to your brain. They're the words then that dictate your actions. There is a little thing in there to, that both you and I can often forget, before we can even say, "speak to my heart Lord", God is already listening and speaking to our heart. Our heart is already in conversation with Him. I don't know about you, but I find that the most consoling conversation there is, and I know it works.
