SPECIAL PARISH INFORMATION AND ARCHDIOCESAN EVENTS

Today whilst I was reading Luke's Gospel (Luke 12), there were some words that spoke to me and they are "When a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God."

So, what is God saying to me and the reader in this text? He is saying that He, God has a different currency to you and I. Imagine if when I looked at my bank account and had a register of deposits being good works and a register of withdrawals based on sinful or inaction my average sense of self-worth says. "I would be in deficit; overdrawn and at foreclosure stage. This is essentially what I hear in this passage. That the currency that has real value is God's currency, not money. So, what is His currency – good deeds based in faith! And Faith alone without good deeds is not much at all. Some faith traditions believe that it is by good deeds alone that salvation is attained. This is not so. Others hold that it is by faith alone that one inherits salvation. This too is not so. Our Lord Jesus Christ is explicit. Remember, Jesus' response to the question "Which is the greatest commandment?" He gave the teaching of the Two Commandments of Love.

So how do I apply this message that Jesus has given me in our life today, right now? How do I respond? I need to make deposits today and each day. Deposits of God's currency so that in His eyes I am rich. It means nothing to God if and what others think that I am successful in a worldly or material way. It only matter what God thinks of me. So as from today, right now I will do some good deeds. But very importantly I need to have purity that if I am doing any good actions that it is with the intention and to make sure the intention to show God's love for us. So, I ask God to guide me today and to provide me with an opportunity to do good deeds with HIS currency and with love. Often, providers be it either gender, frequently treat the role as the total definition of ourselves. Good provider, good person. One of the risks associated with this approach is that there is never enough money to earn that will satisfy the definition of a good provider, a good person and thus we become solely focused on earning the wrong currency. Sure, we have to provide but we can trust that God will provide at the same time (2 Corinthians 9:3, 6:9) and put more effort into the currency of good deeds based on faith, as this is which ultimately pleases God.
