Your place of Triumph The story goes. The Devil - that master of disguise - tried to get into heaven by pretending he was the risen Christ. He gathered a number of his faithful demonic friends and disguised them as angels of light. He had them cry out with great jubilation the beginning of Psalm 24, the traditional welcome psalm: 'Gates, raise your arches, rise your ancient doors, let the King of glory in!" (PS 24:9). The real angels saw and heard this display, and they thought it truly was their risen Lord returning in *triumph* from the dead. So, they in their turn, shouted back the joyful refrain: 'Who is this King of Glory?" (Ps 24:10). That is where the devil made his fatal mistake, egoist that he is, he opened wide his arms and the palms and confidently declared "I am!" the angels were not fooled, they slammed gates shut. They knew right away this was not their risen Lord - there were no nail marks on his palms. The imposter had no wounds of love; whoever this was he had not paid the price of love. All though Lent we have visited the holy places where Jesus encountered the challenge to love - where Jesus paid the price. This was his road to *triumph*, and it is ours. Do you bear the marks of love? Does every grey hair on your head remind you of a worry you poured out for someone else? Is there and extra line below your eye because you lost sleep over someone? Are your hands worn because you gave everything you had for another? Are the pathways in your brain eternally directed toward the giving of love? Are the words that come readily from your lips words of kindness and forbearance? Are the lungs of your soul free from carbon monoxide poisoning of gossip and detraction? Does your whole demeanour tell God that you know yourself to be forgiven? Does your face break out in a smile at the thought of God's great love for you? Are your eyes clear, holding no resentment or bitterness? Is your heart beating strongly with compassion? Are your feet set in the direction of love even if they wander every now and then? Are your arms stretched wide to give someone else another chance? Are you blind to the faults of others? Are you deaf to the awful things said about others? If your answer is "Yes" then welcome! Whether you know it or not, you have been touched by grace. You have been called by Jesus to "come and see" him in others, and you have loved God in your neighbour. Furthermore, remember you have been travelling that direct road from the real love in your life to Calvary. It is a well-worn path travelled firstly by Jesus who cut down all the thornbushes on his way to make it easier for you. Your place of triumph is assured. But may I give you a tip? Triumph for God does not look the same as triumph in the world. You won't have a chest full of medals, you won't have the best clothes, you will not necessarily be well spoken of, and most people may well never know you even existed. Yet, angels will blare out their trumpets at the sight of you - it is indeed their risen Lord in you! After all. "It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me" (Gal 2:20)
