COVID 19 & Flu Virus. It is wonderful that the boarders have opened, and families can be reunited. Alas Parishioner, COVID has not been defeated nor has it stopped!!!! There are reports of new strands that have been detected. As you know, the Archbishop has directed that we, as responsible, caring citizens, are to comply with the Authority guidelines. They are simple measures in trying to contain or at least minimise the spread of the virus. Sadly, a degree of complying individuals have contracted COVID, that includes Archbishop Costello and other priests in the diocese. Clergy and religious are not exempt from contracting COVID! Consider the effects on the Community of not being able to minister to those in need. As this weekend we are given both the beautiful and powerful parable of the Good Samaritan, I ask that we all recommit to our responsibility of exercising duty of care of each other, especially at this time of the pandemic and the flu season. The Eucharist is an outpouring of love and charity from the nature of God. If we believe in the Eucharist and all that flows from it, then let us be living witnesses to what we celebrate and profess. Yes, we are still required to refrain from certain actions or encouraged to forgo privileges normally attributed in the manner we participate in the Eucharist and the Sacraments. I am sure Jesus knows of these small sacrifices undertaken out of love and care of each other. Jesus was practical in his teaching and ministry. The Pharisees and the Scribes found that difficult. I ask that if you are not well, to remain home. Do not come to Mass. I encourage that we all thoroughly sanitise our hands upon entry into the church. That the sign of peace be given by non-bodily contact. That before departing, the pew area one occupies is sanitised with the provided disinfectant/water and cloth. Do not recycle the Bulletin sheets, take them home. If you wish, exercise the wearing of masks. Cover your face when to sneezing or coughing. Exercise good basic hygiene. Do not leave used tissues etc in the pews. Take them home and dispose of them there. I wish to thank all those who have continued to follow the guidelines given by the Authority. Let us practice precaution rather than suffer illness or a shutdown. Again, thank you. Fr. Michael.

"Now will you forgive him?"

A friend of mine let's call her Annie told me a wonderfully true story from her own experience which made a big impact on me. I hope it will speak to you. She was telling me about her dearest friend in all the world who had died of heart trouble. This friend had been married for some twenty years, a seemingly happy marriage with four teenage children. Then she had discovered that her husband, let's call him Jack, had been having an affair for some time. She was shattered and naturally she in her anguish looked for support in Annie. The latter was incensed on behalf of her friend. She wanted to go and tell Jack exactly what she thought of him and by the rendition she gave me, trust me it wasn't flattering. Being a woman of faith, Annie went to the Lord and raved and ranted saying "How could Jack do this to my friend?' He was a low life etc., etc.," and she was quite capable of telling God what she thought. She opened the Bible, and you guessed it, it fell open to the story of the woman caught in the sin of adultery; Annie was ready to find something else when something stopped her. So, she closed her eyes and as she did, she could see Jack in the place of that woman in the Scriptures.

He had his back to Annie in this prayer image, but she could see the face of Jesus looking at her. His eyes were full of compassion, and they were saying "Forgive him, forgive him." Annie with many tears resolutely refused and repeated again and again what she thought of Jack and how unworthy of forgiveness he was. Then she saw Jesus reach out to Jack and draw him to himself in a long embrace. Jack crying on his shoulder. In a matter of milliseconds Annie saw Jack disappear into Jesus who once again looked up at Annie, His eyes pleaded, "Now will you forgive him?" The response this time was different. "How could I not forgive him, he is you." May I suggest that this may be a good way of looking at the various people who need forgiveness in our own life. And then again as another friend said, "There is always more, and He is the more." Sometimes the hardest person to forgive is ourselves. If that is the place for you perhaps it's time to close your eyes, see Jesus melting into you and hear him call to you "Now will you forgive yourself?" Pray this week for those who struggle and are in the need of the gift of forgiveness beginning with oneself.
