SPECIAL PARISH INFORMATION AND ARCHDIOCESAN EVENT

The prophet Isaiah presents the people of Israel with a simple proposition: if they help the poor and needy in their midst, God will immediately hear their prayers and heal them. The implication is clear. The people have not shared what they have with the hungry, they have not sheltered the homeless; they have not clothed the poor. Because of this, God refuses to hear them, leaving them in their self-inflicted gloom and darkness. But Isaiah insists, if they turn away from false and malicious speech and "that if you bestow bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; then light shall rise for you in darkness." Thereby making an explicit connection between caring for the poor and light. Paired with today's Gospel (in which Jesus calls his disciples to be the light of the world and to allow their good deeds to shine before all), we begin to intuit that the call to "be light" will necessarily involve work on behalf of the poor and oppressed. This is the call for all disciples, but particularly of the lay member of the faithful whose vocation is to order society justly according to the values of the Gospel. As St. John Paul II has reminded us; "It is necessary, then, ... to keep a watchful eye on this world... whose... affairs pose problems and grave difficulties... this is the field which the faithful are called to fulfill their mission... to be "salt of the earth" and the "light of the world" (c.f. Matt. 5:13-14) In bringing the light of Christ to the world, "the disciples of Christ... hope to offer., and authentic Christian witness... they seek to enhance the dignity of women and men... so people are helped to attain salvation by the love of God and love of humanity; the mystery of Christ begins to shine out" (Ad gentes 12)
