## **PROFESSION OF FAITH**

# SPECIAL PARISH INFORMATION AND ARCHDIOCESAN EVENT

**Pastoral Notes.** Lent began on Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting binds those who have completed their eighteenth year, until the beginning of their sixtieth year; the law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year (CCL97, 1251 f). If an individual requires to take sustenance for medical reasons, they are exempt of the rule of Fast, "Common sense prevails".

As Lent begins, the readings invite us to meditate on two men. The first man, Adam, gave into his mistrust or hunger for power and broke the promise that he had made to God, who formed him from the dust and gave him life. The second man, Jesus, ushered in the dawn of the new creation by refusing to mistrust God or seize power for himself. Through a life of obedience, crowned by submitting even to the pain and darkness of death, Jesus undid Adams act of disobedience.

When faced with temptation a choice must be made. Reason alone is not sufficient to ensure that a particular choice is in line with divine law. Human reason needs divine truth as its guide in order to safeguard against weakness and inclination to sin: "(Reason), becomes human only... if it looks beyond itself. Otherwise, our human situation, in view of the imbalance between our material capacity and the lack of judgement in our hearts, becomes a threat for ourselves and for creation". In addition to reason, God has given each of us an innate capacity to discern between right and wrong. But God as Creator of all, has stamped our inner most being with an order revealed by our conscience. We show the work of the law written in our hearts. The conscience bears witness to how we live. One could ask how could it be otherwise? We believe that all created beings reflect the infinite wisdom of God. As we progress in our spiritual life, reflect on the Word of God, receive formation in faith and grow in virtue, the capacity to effectively use our conscience in moral decisions-making increases. We are reminded by the father of the Church, that a person's rightly formed conscience is the best help in making a moral choice based in accord with reason and divine law.

**Prayer for this week.** Ever-creative God, just as you created in the beginning, you continue to create today. As your love for us is ceaseless. May we be ever mindful of your creative and passionate love. Through Jesus Christ, who was in the beginning and for all time. **Amen.**
