"Look for the patterns."

Those of you who do Sudoku may have woken up to what I am about to say; it can be most challenging for some and a "breeze" for others. I have a friend who is a mathematician, and he claims it is an easy task to complete. "How so?" I asked. "The key to the problem is to identify the pattern. You then logically know where the numbers are to be put." was his reply. Some of us need help to see the pattern; therefore, Sudoku is complex, and you may never get past the moderate level.

Further, I was talking to someone the other day, and they told me they know of another person who can look at a bunch of clovers and immediately pick out the four-leaf clover. He asked, "How can you do that?" They replied, "It's easy; you can see the pattern!" Have you seen a four-leaf clover among the patterns recently" I have not! Hearing this has prompted me to look at various patterns around the place. Whilst visiting one of my godchildren, I looked at the slate floor that is a feature in one of their family homes. There are patterns, and yet they are all different in every tile. Some are drawings of various kinds, some simple artistry so that the whole tile looks like a well-balanced vase of flowers. Every time I look at a new tile, it's a constant source of surprise and wonder. A whole new world opens up from the humble tile on the slate floor, which, may I add, I relish walking upon in summertime. As I look around, it is true. There are patterns simply everywhere, not just on the floor. I began to think there are patterns of God everywhere too. For we can see ways in how we respond to situations, there are matching patterns of God.

His pattern is to respond with kindness, understanding, and forgiveness, all woven into a personal and particular drawing that is love, a love for you and me. Like the slate floor, He does it in various ways, and you count on it. In the Book of Lamentations, Chapter 3:22-23, we read, "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases. His mercies never end, and they are new every morning. Great is his faithfulness." In other words, though his patterns are new, they are the same, and He is hoping you will see them today.
