God's Memory

Recently, well in fact it was Boxing Day with Mum presiding over the T.V. control we watched an episode of a series that had been seen years and years ago. The television series was "Upstairs Downstairs". (Mum was an avid follower of the series then and as a family we endured it). This episode along came a very familiar scene. I knew what was coming. In this scene one of the key characters, a woman, would come in, sporting a purple suit. The dress of the time was 1915. She was also sporting a small hat and from memory she had red hair. She would talk to a Colonel in a blue uniform, a dark blue uniform. He would have had one arm and a scar on his face and the obligatory moustache. They would have a conversation about how this woman would want her husband to get back into active service. Yes, the Colonel would listen most attentively understand the wisdom of what she was saving and agree. Right, well that's how I remembered it. Then came the scene as it really was. The Colonel was in fact a Major and he was dressed in kaki uniform. He wore a black glove and there was no indication of a missing arm. He was in kaki not in a dark blue uniform and the only thing I got right was that he had a moustache. The woman when she came in, had a flowing yellow dress (a bit race for the time, I think) and a big hat. The only part about her that I got right was that she came into the room, and she didn't have red hair either. The conversation as it really was that she indeed put forward her case and in fact he did not agree right away. It would take a few more episodes, so Mum reminded me.

"How is it" I said to myself that I could have got it so totally wrong. Alright, it was some 40 years ago when we all saw it but nonetheless how did I get it so wrong. That led me to think there is so much in our memories that we get wrong. So much in our memories that we simply don't see in the way they really were.

It seems to be a great blessing to be able to review our past life from the correct memory of God. You and I can look back at our mistakes, our sins where we are blameworthy and even now, we can still be beating ourselves up about all those past things. Yet that is not the memory of God. If only we could see things, view things, and know things from the memory of God.

God doesn't see somebody who has intentionally left the track. He sees somebody who was lost. God's memory of the pain you and I put ourselves through, the pain of all the things that we have done wrong is so different to ours. God's memory of that is of someone he lovingly went and looked for. God's memory is the agony in his own heart as we walked, while he watched what we were doing to ourselves.

God's memory is of how he came and got us. Perhaps it is a grace worth praying for like this. "Father give me the grace to see my life as you see it. Give me the grace to remember and to know again the mercy you have lovingly poured out in my regard. And Father, may I ask the grace to review all those who have known in the same light. Amen."
