### **“To Die For”**

I heard the other day an expression used by some and both times I heard it had an impact on me. The first time it was “That chocolate is to die for.” The second time it was “You knew we would have to have the ice cream that is to die.” I thought their chocolate was to die for the ice-cream is to die for?! Hello! Now I know of course what they were really saying, they were saying that these two items possessed incomparable taste instilling an incredible sense of wellbeing in their wake. But nonetheless it made me realise how out of kilter we really are. Our language betrays us and shows us up for the shallow beings we sometimes are. Would any one of us die for chocolate? Would any one of us put our head on the chopping block for an ice cream? It begs the question doesn’t it. What would you and I die for? Who would you and I die for? I suspect it is only a person who has loved deeply or who does love deeply who can answer that question. If we do not love or we have never loved, then we have nothing worthwhile dying for. Everything is replaceable. It is only love that fills our vision with what is truest. It is only love that takes us out of ourselves and places our life squarely at the disposal of another at the disposal of something greater than ourselves. Take a minute later to consider this in your own life and you will find it is true. I sat with a friend after his little son died and I heard my friend say “Why could it not have been me? I would rather have died and let him live.” Part of me thinks my friend did die that day with his son. It could not have been otherwise. If love calls us into life in all its forms, then it calls us into death in all its forms. And where did this outstandingly beautiful attribute of humankind come from? What is the source of this kind of living? I only have one answer. It is the God who says to you and me “You, you are to die for, and I will do it.” And Jesus Christ did die for you and me and in so doing secured us love in all its forms for ever! How could we ever thank him enough?
