The Never-ending Story. One of the saddest passages in the gospels I think can be found in Mark (5:1-20). We read there of a demoniac from the land of Gerasa. The poor man seemingly held captive by who knows what but whatever it was his life was unbearable. He roamed around on his own among the tombs, amongst things that were dead and held no possibility of life. How many of us have done that? He hurt himself and who of us do not know somebody who is into self-harm. And he howled! How terrible that must have been! You could hear it from the depths of his despair. Then one day along came Jesus and I guess supposing recognising goodness and healing personified he threw himself down at the feet of Jesus. Mark tells us that Jesus attended to it and the man was free. When the people came back, they saw a man wholly within his own senses but when the time came to leave and the man was asked to go with Jesus; and this is the part which saddens me, Jesus said "No". Instead, he told him to go back to his home and tell the people what God had done for him. Only upon much reflection that I had seen that, that decision it would have cost Jesus a fair bit. In the ordinary human way. I have no doubt that Jesus would have taken that man with him but sometimes in life we have to look at the bigger picture for ourselves and for others and leave behind what we want for the greater good. The greater good was achieved because when Jesus visited that region again later in the gospels people came down to meet him whereas before they had told him to go. It seems to me that our lives are all we have to tell, the never-ending story of what God has done and what we have done with God. Which you know the word eternity written around the convict, penial settlements of Australia for so many years was testimony to a terrible life of a Governor called Arthur who found God through the preaching of a wonderful pastor and never stopped of telling the never-ending story. What message do our lives carry? It is one of self-centred preoccupation? Is it one that extols the gospel of crime, worldliness, superficiality, or is it a life that speaks of kindness, understanding, generosity, all the attributes we find and have found in God? Perhaps this week we all might look at our life and ask ourselves "What story is my life telling? When I pray, do I pray hoping to change God's will for me? Here is a little secret though. If we ask God what story his life was telling you will find his life always tells your story.
