COVID 19 VIRUS AND FLU 2022

Dear Parishioners, I once again thank you for your response of vigilance and exercising duty of care of each other in the collective effort of minimising the spread of the dreaded COVID 19 Virus and its variants and the "seasonal influenza virus." Nasty stuff." I believe it is something we might just have to live with for a while. Much has again been expressed in the media about possible mandatory guidelines, nevertheless the tried-and-true formulae of "prevention over cure" is the suggested path to travel. Simply:

- 1. If you are unwell remain home and stay isolated. Dispensation from attending Mass under such circumstances is granted.
- 2. Put good hygiene procedures into practice i.e. Wash your hands up to the level of your wrist with soapy water, for at least twenty seconds, and often.
- 3. If you are going to sneeze or cough cover your mouth or face when doing so with a tissue or handkerchief.
- 4. Do not leave used tissues of handkerchiefs lying in the pews or the ground. Take them home and dispose of them there.
- 5. Avail yourself to and liberally apply the hand sanitisation fluid to your hands, prior to entering the church... even if you are late for Mass. The dispensers are found on the table at the entrance, in the foyer of the church. Adults this applies to you as well as to children.
- 6. Be a helpful co-worker and co-carer by sanitising the hard surface area of the pew you occupied during Mass. The disinfectant solution and cloths are clearly situated at points in the church.
- 7. If you desire to wear face mask, do so. It is no longer mandatory except in high-risk settings; encouraged where physical distancing is not possible... (note subject to change at a moment's notice from Authorities). Again, a sincere thank you for your positive stewardship in our Faith Community. **Fr. Michael.**

Robert Knighton

I didn't know of a man called Robert Knighton, but perhaps you have heard of him. He was convicted of murder in 1990 in Oklahoma U.S.A. He murdered an elderly couple in the sixties. The couple had an adopted daughter, Sue Norton who would at that time be a grown woman. She was taught always to forgive. But at the trial she could not get her head around anything except for anger and a desire for vengeance. The lingering thought though was "I need to pray for him. I need to forgive him" but that was a tall order. It increased as she heard about Knighton's horrific background of abuse in the coming days. At the trial's end she asked to see him which I imagine would be a very frightening thing to do. He was a big man, chained and angry. Sue simply said to him "If you are guilty, I forgive you" and put her hand through the bars of the cell to shake his hand. He pulled back but she grabbed his hand and began to pray. She said later that forgiveness is really a gift to ourselves not for the forgiven. She said executions just turn more families into victims. Sue began visiting Robert. She wrote to him; she became sort of a friend to him. In her other life she lost many of her friends, they were people who could not understand the position she had taken. When in 2003 Robert was executed; Sue was there, his only friend.

You know sometimes I think God is like that. He forgives us more for his sake than ours. He can't bear to see our pain and he forgives so whole heartedly that is as though our offenses never happened. What matters is the friendship between God and the soul. How I wish I had the word to convey that truth, to convince anyone who doubts God's forgiveness of them. Our treatment of others, I believe is simply the overflow of how God is with us.
