SPECIAL PARISH INFORMATION AND ARCHDIOCESAN EVENT

Christians are very use to be criticised for all sorts of things. "Ah the church is too wealthy. The leaders are focused on power. The leaders don't care enough for the poor" and the list goes on. Generally, there are very good answers for these accusations, and it is easy to dismiss them as "the arrogance" of unbelievers. Yet perhaps there is a need to listen to what lies beneath the claims. While these people might be trying to reason for not to submit their lives to God, they may also be reacting out of genuine sense what Christianity should be. The high standard that the world places on the Church might actually well be a prophetic call for us to rethink the way that we live. Back in the fifth century the very passionate preacher John Chrysostom who once said to his Church "Do you know the reason why the heathen refuse to believe us? Because they expect of us to prove the Truth of our teaching by deeds and not by words. When they see us building fine houses, buying baths and gardens and broad lands they do not believe that we really regard our time here on earth as simply a preparation for eternal life. Thus, do we betray the mission that Christ has entrusted to us?" John Chrysostom was truly challenging his Christian community. His direct words also challenge us today. Maybe God is using our most vocal critics to call us to look again how our lives and where our priorities lay. We may cast our minds to how Jesus sent out the disciples on the mission. Christianity is like that. It is never something to be kept for oneself. It always involves outreach to others. Without that element it would not be Christianity. Jesus empowered the disciples. Christ also empowers us. The apostle's mission was first a spiritual one and of preaching repentance, the imminent coming of God and it involved also the physical and mental healing. For God is concerned with the whole person, soul and body. As disciples of Christ, he challenges, us to be active not passive nor possessive followers of his. No matter what our social position is we are called always to be mindful of the poor and to be by continually lobbying for justice for those who have no voice. The story is told of a man who was exasperated of the state of the world around him. He shouted to God, "Why don't you do something about this!" "But I have." replied God - "I have created you." We are God's hands, voice and feet.

St. Mary of the Cross (St. Mary Mackillop). There is a larger-than-life bronze statue which portrays a young vibrant Mary. Sculptor, Louis Laumen, explains the image depicts Mary descending a staircase, as if she had just been upstairs to put on her habit for the very first time" We see a Sister Mary MacKillop, not on a pedestal, but stepping down and stepping out, with love that is real and active, and clutching a book. And we recall Mary writing, "To me, the will of God is a very dear book which I never tire of reading." (1873). The bronze statue of Mary MacKillop is a reminder to us to step out and follow Christ by serving those around us with love". "Never see a need without doing something about it. Have courage and patience and God will help you in all things right." "Let us resign ourselves into His hands and pray that in all things He may guide us to do His Holy Will. When thoughts of this come, I turn to Him and say:" Only what you will, my God. Use me as you will". "Whatever troubles you may before you, accept them bravely, remembering Whom you are trying to follow. Do not be afraid. Love one another, bear with one another, and let charity guide you all your life. God will reward you as only He can." Mary MacKillop.

The data collected will greatly assist this Archdiocese and the wider Catholic Church in Australia in responding to the needs of Catholics in the future. Thank you for your co-operation.
