SPECIAL PARISH INFORMATION AND ARCHDIOCESAN EVENTS

There is a great Jewish story told about the crossing of the Red Sea. We are all familiar with the real story. The Israelites had been enslaved in Egypt and they are set free in the most dramatic circumstances. In this story the water of the Red Sea parting, and whilst it provided the means for the Israelites to get across safely. The receding waters means the death and an obliteration of the pursuing Egyptian army. The story goes that after the event the Israelites were of course jubilant, dancing, singing to their hearts content, praising God.

God however was sitting on a rock looking into the sea crying. The Israelites couldn't make it out and said to Him, "Why are you so sad? Look we have been saved. The Egyptians are all dead and we are free!"

God simply looked at them and replied quietly, "Yes, I know but they were my children too." We don't often think about that do we?

The very people who give us grief, who wreck our day, who are rude to us, who tell lies about us etc., etc., perhaps we are thinking of someone as we read this... these very people are God's children too.

He cries over them too.

He cries over their misguidedness, their sinfulness, over the anguish which have made them who they are.

We can easily think in the terms of "goodies" and "bodies" and see life only in these terms. Listen to any conversation you like, and you will hear it.

But God on the other hand who would walk over a bed of hot coals for each one of us, He has the incredible compacity to be on all our sides.

Would it not make a difference if we could all be like that too? I suspect that if we even begin thinking like that only once a day, we would notice a huge shift in everything we see around us. We would also see that we are all called to be part of the Body of Christ. How do I see myself as belonging to the Body of Christ?

How do I express in my daily living the truth of "Corpus Christi? "How can we go beyond a good or virtuous life, to creatively witness to the good news of Christ's incarnation and resurrection? "People today are crying out for recognition. They want to be persons among persons. They want to be noticed not in a showy way, or because they have money or status, but because they are human beings.

Each of us is on a pilgrimage. We are seeking to encounter others who have the same needs as ourselves.

The greatest need of all is the need to be loved. But we can pass one another by without noticing, without the slightest sign of recognition. As Christians we are united by a bond so close that St. Paul called the Christian community "the Body of Christ". It is time we all noticed one another. Each person is a brother or sister of Christ. Each person then must be recognized. Each person must be given some sign of friendship, be it only a smile or a nod of the head. Jesus warmly encourages us to be light to the world - to shine like lamps, so that in us. God's goodness is revealed "to everyone in the house."
