God and Love. In July last year a world renowned composer died. His name was Ennio Morricone and at the time of his death he had more than 400 works to his name. During an interview recorded, not long before his death Morricone was asked if he had a favourite from amongst all his compositions. In reply he said, "Asking me if I had a favourite is like asking a parent if she or he had a favourite child." Morricone went onto explain that he did not have a favourite because each and every one was the result of hard work and suffering. We read in the Scriptures that the apostle Peter declared that God does not have favourites. Each and every human being is loved by God. Each and every human being, thanks to the suffering of Jesus Christ has been redeemed. No one is excluded from the favour of God. But this does not mean that we cannot grow in God's favour or that some may become more pleasing to God than others. In the gospel we learn that the Lord sometimes, delighted in the greatness of faith in some and that at times he was saddened by the lack of faith in others. One of the sure ways that we can grow in faith and become ever more pleasing to God is by keeping in mind the extent of God's personal love for each of us. As we hear in the gospels "No greater love is possible than that of the laying down of one's life for another.' Well, in Jesus Christ this is what God has done for us and it is this "loving unto death" that we now remember. We also speak of love as though it is always wonderful, yet the reality is that it can often be terrifying. When someone approaches you and bears their soul, speaking of their undying love for you. It demands a response. It is as though love breaks into your life like an intruder demanding that your life changes according to its demands. While we may never consciously think of love in this way there can be a deep fear, that we will lose something of our freedom or autonomy if we allow the love of another to take over our life. This is particularly the case with Christ. We can find it very threatening to acknowledge the madness of God's love shown through his birth in Bethlehem or his death on Calvary. The safest option which is being used throughout the Church history is to wrap the story up in a nice pious or theological coating so that the personal reality of this love never has to impact us. Perhaps it is time to step away from our fear. Allow ourselves to be loved and let the love of Christ set its demands upon our lives.
