PROFESSION OF FAITH

PARISH ADVENT: Second Rite of Reconciliation Christmas Preparation (COVID PERMITTING) This Wednesday 14th December at 7.00p.m. Keep this date and time free and noted in your diaries. It will be that wonderful opportunity to hand over to the Lord that which we have been keeping and carrying in the "dark space" of our being.

Do you believe that I can do this? Two challenging and beautiful readings we are given in this Advent period comes from Isaiah 29:17-24 and from the gospel of Mathew 9:27-31, the telling of the two blind men seeking Jesus and pleading for his mercy. There is a clear question in these texts. Do you believe that God can do this? Do we really believe that God can open the eyes of the blind, bring fruitfulness and fertility, bring down tyrants and those who scoff, destroy those who are disposed to do evil? I am sure at times we are all left with doubts as we look out at our society. Wars continue to rage, injustice towards the poor and the marginalised continues. Domestic violence and addiction riddle our society. Personally, we may be suffering hardships, losses, and setbacks in our own life journey. However, Jesus continues to ask the question especially on our witness "Do you believe I can do this? Do you believe that I can bring healing and hope and new life to what seems insurmountable problems, difficulties, and sufferings? Our Gospel provides a clue as to the steps we need to take in answering "YES" to Jesus' question. Firstly, the blind men turn to Jesus, they sought Him out and desired to come into his presence. How often do we first turn to ourselves or one another rather than firstly turning to Jesus? Turning to him personally is always the first step, turning towards Jesus with the desire for healing and new life. Secondly, they ask with confidence and trust believing that indeed He did have the power to answer their request. How often would the shepherd leave the ninety-nine and go after the missing one? Most of the time, apparently. That is why Jesus phrases it as a rhetorical question, as though saying, this is just common sense: a shepherd always goes after the one that wanders off. It follows then that if the average shepherd goes after one lost sheep, then if God is our shepherd, no matter how lost we get, we can count on him coming after us. This verse is to many a favourite verse in Scripture - the idea of God valuing each one of us, pursuing us, finding us, rejoicing over us. God cares for the lowliest, the most morally erring, the ones that have wandered farthest. And I like that Jesus opens with "what do you think?' Well, as ones who have done our share of wandering, we like it. As we approach the birth of Jesus let us ask him to strengthen our faith and trust that through Him all things are possible. Let us ask for our deepest need and desire, not just out of habit but out of a trusting faith that says "Yes, Lord you can do this. Lord, I place my trust in you."
