“I will be with you always.” Put Fire in our belly. Jesus remains active in calling each one of us to follow him. The call to follow is challenging and as Jesus warns “the road is hard, the gate is narrow, and few find it.” However, it offers a great truth, to enter the narrow gate. You need to desire what it offers and accept the cost required to achieve it. Each day we make choices about how we will encounter others and God. We make decisions about what is important and what we will prioritise. Only we can determine whether we will live up to our calling or whether we will float along and generally live a good life. **The call of Jesus is a “wake up” call: Don’t be complacent!** What do we need to do, to ensure we are on the narrow path? How can we love others in a way that is worthy of the love we have been offered? What will I give in time and attention to? Are we walking this road alone? These probing questions brings to memory of an experience had whilst on one of our annual clergy retreats, held in a beautiful part of our nation. On one of the days of the retreat we were given the opportunity to go and find a quiet place to reflect upon how we saw the next stage of our priesthood developing. As a young priest then, I was not sure what lay ahead. So, I headed out like everybody else did to find an isolated place. Just up the road I found an unsealed road that led down to a little inlet. As it was a hot day after arriving at the beach I “parked” myself under the shade of a tree for a while. At that stage the beach was deserted and having rested I then made way to walk along the beach. After walking a stretch, I had this feeling that I should write a sentence in the sand. The sentence was **“I will be with you always”**. After I had written it, I stood there for some time and walked away from the water and again found some shade under a leafy tree and I pondered for a while, and I had to admit I fell asleep (not hard to do when one is on retreat). Later when I got back to where I was staying there was some little excitement as another one of the priests was sharing how he was walking along the isolated part of the beach and asking God why he felt so lost and alone then looked down and there in the sand were the words **“I will be with you always.”** I did not say anything at the time. But I spoke to him at the end of the retreat, and I admitted that I had written those words, but I did not understand what they meant for me or for him for that matter. Looking back after all these years I know that these have been a great source of strength and support for me when times have been challenging. But they have also been a support when things have been going well. I know that they supported my brother priest when he saw them, and they gave him life at that stage of his life journey.

Upon reflection, if we were to apply radical gratitude in this episode of life and also ask of ourselves how we can grow in gratitude I suggest that there are three ways: The first is to recognise the blessing that we have received. The second is to look beyond the blessing, to look at the giver of the blessing, the Lord. And finally, to actively practice this gratitude. Several things happened that day on the beach. Firstly, I had found a quiet place and that stage a deserted beach. Secondly, I entered the call to write something in the sand that has stayed with me through the years. The other thing that happened was that my priest friend was actually looking at the sand as he walked and not looking out to sea or the bush where I was sleeping. Sometimes we miss the presence of God in our midst because our focus is elsewhere. Today I hope that we might see God in the small little signs, circumstances or persons and know the Lord is saying to you and me **“I will be with you always.”** May we pray every day to the Holy Spirit to infuse us, put **“fire in our belly”** to desire, recognise and acknowledge God and the courage to follow Jesus and not count the cost!
