**Walking for others.** I recently heard about a woman by the name of Alisa Piper. Alisa is an Australian, a journalist, a director and an actor. Alisa walked the well-known pilgrimage track "Camino" that stretches from France to Spain. Pilgrimages in ancient times was something one undertook to make amends for one's sins and also as a means of thanksgiving. It involved dependence on others and inevitably one discovers that one brought too much luggage. It generally got discarded along the way. Usually, the walk ended at a Sacred Christian site. In Norway it so often ended in Nidaros, Trondheim Cathedral. To this day you can see the black stained pillars where the tired pilgrims lent their weary, tired, unwashed bodies against the solidity of the house of God. In their minds and hearts God had heard their prayers and forgiveness or atonement or whatever had been accomplished. I guess it is a bit like people going back to the place of the past. They revisit sites that were once very important places where they had a particular hard time and feel the need to exorcise the demons that still ring within them. Alisa Piper put a new and at the same time a revised spirit in that ancient custom. She walked 1300 kilometres in 45 days and her luggage was compromised of the sins, the wants and the desires of others. It was not an easy walk, it rained, it was hot, it was cold the road was often rough. I imagine she did not always have a choice of the accommodation either. She advertised her intention before she went, and people came out of the woodwork. She said, "Yes, people gave me their sins. From the first day there were confessions, even some from strangers who heard what I wanted to do. Knowing someone would be taking on their sin, the deep seated, shameful skeletons inside so many cupboards; they all came out in for the life giving airing and new home". It appears to me that in a pilgrimage that as in all lives we too can walk for the sins of other. When someone yells at you for whatever reason there is a skeleton waiting to be aired. When someone is rude or insensitive or dismissive of you on your road through life, a skeleton is asking for a new home. Instead of condemning or retaliating I wonder could we too bear the sins of others with a smile, with understanding. It certainly takes courage but then after all Jesus did it and he wound upon the cross. Surely as Christians we can do no less. In carrying sins of others, we also can cure the world.
