**Cardinal Basil Hume** You may remember Cardinal Archbishop Basil Hume, OSB., cardinal archbishop of Westminster. Some of you might also remember the television program "The Two Fat Ladies". They were hilarious in their own right and they seem to cook at the most incredible places. Once they cooked at a luncheon that Basil Hume was attending so they made a desert of red jelly signifying the cardinal's red hat and then they put a sprig of basil poking out of the jelly. It appeared humorous at the time. However, Basil himself was originally a Benedictine monk and an abbot of his monastery before he was made a bishop and cardinal. He did much good work; he was a very pastoral man. It was said of him "that he knew our hearts and we trusted him." What a wonderful thing to say about anyone. He learnt two months before his death that he had terminal cancer. On hearing the prognosis his initial response was "If I could start all over again I would be a much better monk, a much better bishop, But then I thought he said, How much better it would be if I could come before God when I die not to say thank you because I was such a good monk, such a good bishop but to say to him rather, "God be merciful to me a sinner". For if I come empty handed then I will be ready to receive God's gift." It is a salutary thought because literally at the end of the day what do any of us have except for the mercy of God. We strive so hard to be someone. We fight and claw our way up the success ladder even if we do it only in our mind. We want to leave a great name behind us perhaps, or achievement. But on our death bed will any of that matter? Will any of that get us across the line? I don't think so. What will get us across the line and into the arms of God will be the little familiar voice we have always used to call out to God. The little voice that has held the confidence that he will hear us. The way a small child calls out for a father when she wakes up from a nightmare. The heart of God is moved then as it is moved today. He reaches out and clings to us as he clings now. It is not the reverse. In fact, every time we say "Have mercy on us" we are already experiencing heaven. Or of a better way of explaining this, it is our littleness and helplessness, our dependence on God that brings him close. What a beautiful thing to go through life calling out to such a God.
