**How Green is your valley**? Some of you might well remember an old, old film of many years ago. It was called "How green is your valley". It was a story of a simple family in Wales. The father and his sons were coal miners at a time of poverty and struggle. The film showed the eventual demise of the way of life. At one point in the film the owners of the mine had reduced the wages, this was in the days of emerging unionism. The old father was content in letting the owners have their way since that is what one did, but the sons were not, they saw the injustice and would have none of it. One night they sat down to dinner and a violent quarrel erupted and the father's authority was challenged. The young men announced their intention to leave home and eventually go to Canada to start a new life. The father was heartbroken. Eventually he said, "Look sit down and let us continue our dinner and we shall say no more about it," but the sons were adamant. They kissed their mother goodbye and left. The father sat despondent at the table. His eight-yearold son though, the youngest was still sitting there unable to eat. He cleared his throat to get his father's attention. "Ahem, ahem". No answer. And again "Ahem, ahem". No answer. He gently banged his knife and fork on the table and cleared his throat again, "Ahem" and this time the white-haired old man lifted his head and quietly said "Yes my son I know that you are still here." With a smile the little lad continued to eat his supper. Sometimes I think that in the middle of the horrors of this present world, sometimes our little works of goodness, little acts of kindness, our little acts of consideration, our little prayers are like that with God. "Ahem" we say to him, and he lifts his head and looks up with incredible love in your direction and says "Yes" he says, "I know you are still here." We have the power to console the hurt of God. Let's do it.
