Ikebana

One of the parishioners in a parish I was once attached to asked if she could do the floral arrangements for the church to honour the day. The parish priest readily gave his permission. So, our friend Agatha who is very good did some ikebana for us. That is that beautiful art of Japanese flower arranging. Agatha came and arrayed with modicum of flowers and set to work slowly and reverently. When finished she simply slipped out of the church and left the results for us to find, they were stunning. I learnt something yet again that day. Ikebana the idea of emptiness allows for each flower to breathe and reveals the contrast among the elements as well as the harmony and the balance found in the asymmetrically arrangement. Ikebana is meant to carry something of a message. To do that it works with space. It does not dominate it. It takes into account what is important in that space and compliments it. It does not stand on its own. I thought of us and how often we try to dominate a space and perhaps think the event, or the situation is all the better for our contribution, when in fact all we really need to pay attention to the emptiness. All we have really done is lift ourselves there, not brought out what already was. We do it so easily. Perhaps because we feel insecure, maybe it's convention or maybe we just don't notice. I thought that it is so often that we are afraid of the apparent emptiness inside us and so we cover it up with noise and who knows what else. I thought of God and the unintrusive way he works. Not with great supplies and armfuls of equipment but rather with simplicity and grace. I pondered about how he works with who we are and does not ask us to be anything else. I pondered how he manages always to bring out the best in you and me. And we don't even notice him at work. Are we really like the Agatha's in Ikebana artwork? Does everything we do point to God or ourselves? I think every time we make the decision to put ourselves out of the picture and focus on someone else, we are working beautifully with God's space, the way he works with the space of our hearts. When our lives point to something other than us the world has been blest, as we the parishioners and I were blest when we walked into our church after Agatha had been at work.
