Play His Song There is an old Jewish legend that goes like this. After David had slain Goliath, King Saul had invited him into his palace in order to honour him. David loved music and was especially delighted to see a harp standing in the corner. Saul said "I paid a lot of money for that, and I have nothing but harsh sounds from it no matter how many of my illustrious musicians play it. David took, it up to try it and drew such an exquisite music from it, every individual in the palace was moved. It seems that the harp sang and laughed and wept. King Saul was shocked and said, "How is it that everyone else is only to been able to draw discord from that harp and you can only bring out the finest of music.?" The future king David replied. "Before me every man tried to play his own song on these strings, but I sang to the harp its own song. I had recalled how it had been a young tree with birds that chirped in its branches and in its limbs that were green with leaves and blossomed in the sun. I reminded it of the day that the men came and cut it down and you could hear her heart weep under my fingers. I explained then that this was not the end and its death as a tree started a new life in which it would glorify God as a harp, and you heard how it rejoiced under my hands. So, the old Jewish teacher said ": When the messiah comes many will try to sing their own song on the harp and their tunes shall be harsh. When we sing on his harp his own song, the song of his life, Passion, joys, sufferings, death and resurrection only then will be our music then true.

Well, the Messiah is here. God does already live amongst us, and I wonder how truly we have come to know him so that when we speak of Him it is truly Himself that we proclaim, not some made up improvised versions of ourselves. The difference is very clear even to the tone deaf who are longing for his music of truth, comfort, understanding, purpose and meaning. We cannot play music we do not know. But if we know him, we cannot but play his song. And there is one more thing, what a delight it is to God when we so abandon ourselves to Him that he can play his song on the harp of our soul. When that happens, I think the music of heaven has already begun.
